My elective practice is in the treatment of complications of fracture surgery – these include non-union, malunion, infection, and soft tissue complications. I have subspecialist expertise in limb lengthening, the treatment of limb deformities, and in osteomyelitis surgery.

I am an examiner for the national and international intercollegiate Surgical Board. I was previously Training Programme Director for the Mersey Region, member of the Specialist Advisory Council, member of the Training Standards Committee of the British Orthopaedic Association and part of Council of the British Limb Reconstruction Society.

Terms of Engagement and Timeframes

I prefer paperless communication - scanned records, separated and labelled appropriately.

My approximate turnaround times are as follows:

Personal Injury reports and Condition and Prognosis Reports (alleged negligence): 10 to 15 working days if all records provided prior to appointment.

An email regarding any further records required to complete my report is usually sent within four working days after I see a claimant for a medicolegal consultation.

Breach of Duty and Causation reports: 30 working days

Completion of reports, including adding records after appointment: 15 working days

Addendum Reports, Letters of correspondence, CPR Part 35 responses: 15 working days

The timeframes quoted exclude periods of Study Leave and Annual Leave. Working days exclude Saturdays, Sundays and Bank Holidays.
